Discussion: 4.01 Review Of Local Control Cannabis Sub-committee: Genesis & Authority

Assistant City Attorney Clauss explained that the LCCC's authority to suspend or revoke local control licenses, rather than its authority to initially grant or deny them, may be a compelling reason to keep the LCCC in place. If a cannabis establishment violates the City's zoning regulations or public-nuisances ordinances, the City would have an additional tool for obtaining compliance. The value of this tool depends upon what effect, if any, the LCCC's revocation of the local control license has on the state-issued license. Assistant City Attorney Clauss agreed to discuss further with members of the state Cannabis Control Board.
