NPA Holiday Date Changes

- Linda moved to change NPA dates to November 18 and December 16 due to holidays the following week. Gus Buchanan seconded. Liam Griffin commented that it is pending availability of the room.
- Passed unanimously.

Public Forum

- Martha Molpus: Attempted break-ins, stay safe.
- Jason L'Ecuyer: Bullying at Hunt a problem, worried about lack of follow-up.

Elected Officials

- School Commissioner Mark Barlow: Welcoming Yaw Obeng, budget process beginning.
- School Commissioner Anne Judson: Act 46 caps affect Burlington as 1.8% allowable increase without incurring penalties, health insurance costs rising.
 - Questions: How is Partnership helping schools? Teacher professional development, flexible pathways, personalized learning.
- Councilor Dave Hartnett: Court rape situation handled effectively but also bringing changes, parking report raising questions for cost to New North End, Uber agreement still under negotiation with tentative license, bus service increases needed, Farrington's MHP transition moving forward.

North Avenue Task Force

- Travel time is currently 7 minutes. Pilot may make travel time take longer.
- Pilot likely to take effect in late spring. Phasing of project an option.
- Radar gun demonstrations happening Thursdays. Next meeting is November 10.

Parking Update, Nicole Losch

- Comprehensive parking plan involving residential, downtown, and multi-unit parking concerns.
- Current strategies under review: limiting residential permits, transit ridership, satellite parking lots, improving wayfinding, time of day restrictions, expanded metering.
- Comment: Bus service in NNE would help alleviate need for cars.
