4. Pesticide Application Start Farm Beach	Brian Sullivan called in to discuss his pesticide application. He is battling Knotweed which is an aggressive invasive species. (This is where the discussion of how many mechanical attempts were made before applying to use pesticides).	Ian motioned to approve; 3 members in favor and two opposed.
5. Pesticide Application Centennial Court Apts	Treeworks application tabled until August as applicant was unavailable.	Celia motioned to table, Julia 2nd
4a. & 5a. Discussion of Pesticide Applications	Caroline began by explaining the application process, the buffer zone, and non-buffer zone requirements. Bill reviewed pesticide injection as per our Parks & Recreation Division. Ian questioned applicant attempts at mechanical removal vs chemical removal. Is there a process in place for how many mechanical attempts before chemical removal becomes the option. Ian proposed two motions. 1. – Improve application questions, requirements. 2. – Mechanical attempts v Chemical use; Put a process in place for pesticide application. How many attempts at mechanical should be tried before submitting application for pesticide use in buffer zones.	.Caroline asked Celeste to get Ian and Celia the Emerald Ash Boarer report from Parks & Rec. Ian motioned; Julie 2nd.
6. Update on City response to Covid-19 Bill Ward	Bill reviewed our Covid-19 response starting with the initial planning; rv's for the homeless,	

	donations and volunteers, food distribution to neighbors, the quarantine system and how to register with the city, as well as the quarantine gift bags that were given out to registrants. The gift bags contained restaurant gift cards, information on how Burlington is handling the virus along with contact information for the RRC. He then went on to tell us where the City is at now with handling of the virus. He proposed that the Board of Health participate in giving out face masks and educating the community about the Covid-19 virus.	Caroline, Celia, Ian, and Bill volunteered to have a table on Church Street on a Saturday.
