Police officer report: Bradley Trombly

Youth bike path safety program is available to show kids how to safely ride on the street.

Officers are trained to pick up syringes, if there's multiple syringes, Howard Center may be contacted to take them, the opioid coordinator Jackie is working on this epidemic.

Hide your values as kids are out of school and theft is on the rise this summer.

Officers are on foot patrol for new north end and motor vehicle enforcement

Vandalism has been occurring around the Miller Center. Although no cameras, BPD responds that there are different forms of investigating.

BPRW- update on Public Parks by interim director Nina Safavi,

Completed phase one of construction, construction is ongoing. John- program manager presents PowerPoint for timeline of construction, mapping and overview. Construction will continue through September. Working with DPW for street weeping, making the space safe as possible during detour periods. Tree markings on bike path indicate to be cut down or not cut down.
