Introductions of attendees

Chris Trombly Ward 7:

A new way to look at CEDO and the HUD, public discussion on May 1st 7pm. Chris has seen many experience's with human interaction and other community members having difficulties speaking up. This will be a place where others can contribute in opinions.

Bishop Tom Ealy:

Provided an introduction of his background and the 10am Sunday service at the Episcopal church. Provided an introduction of what is going on at Rock Point, having 130 acres of property in the heart of Burlington by the lake, off of north beach and the bike path. People are welcome to come onto rockpointvt.org and get a pass to come to Rock Point. There is more information on that website. Chris describes the partnership campaign that raises funds. A brief history of Rock Point and its ownership. One of many ways to access Rock Point is through instituted road by Burlington High School, it provides 2.8miles of trail. Due to mud, trails are closed until approximately May 1st, 2017. Around 10,000 people a year come to rock point for a conference center, meetings and summer camp. Currently they are trying to make access to Rock Point user friendly and more accessible. For someone who doesn't have a computer can how someone donate or get a day pass; someone from the office can assist you. You can also access more information from the North Avenue News

There is a day pass, annual pass and also a group pass. There is no cost for the pass but you can make a donation as you please.

The space holds a valuable history of the punk rock venue built by youth over the past decades, and supported by Bernie Sanders.
