3. Confidential discussion of offender reentry cases – reviewed and approved two new Circles of Support & Accountability (COSA). Heard updates from Stuart Recicar on other upcoming and current COSAs.
4. Discussed new MOUs and other grant/funding opportunities, including Offender Workforce Development Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with Salvation Farms, updated MOU with BPD, and update on MOU with Community Justice Network of Vermont (CJNVT) for donations that require 501c3 status. Also checked in about Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) proposal and Vermont Legal Aid's youth reentry proposal that would include collaborating with Chittenden County CJs.
5. Checked in on CEDO/CJC strategic planning. CEDO has undertaken process to revisit vision, mission and values, and to set high level strategic goals that will trickle down to division level, team level, and individual goals. Anneke will bring updates to CAC as this process continues.
