Discussion Topics and Action Items:

(1) Presentation: Jackie Corbally, Burlington PD Opioid Coordinator

Provided latest information re the state of combatting opioid addiction in Burlington, including the fact that “street opioids” are much stronger, increasing the likelihood of overdoses; that Narcan (naloxone) is in full use by the Police Department; and that Vermont law is changing so that opioids will be prescribed for no more than 3-4 days instead of 90 days.

(2) Presentation: Alternative City Hall Park Vision, Carolyn Bates and Charles Simpson

Advocated for a plan other than the one currently being pursued by the City, which they said would cost \$3 million and result in the loss of the historic fountain.

(3) School Board Update: Miriam Stoll, South District School Board Commissioner

Shared details about the latest budget request for \$74 million, an increase of 5.25% from the previous year’s budget of \$70 million of which \$1.5 million is non-discretionary, e.g., via debt servicing and the State’s mandate for universal preschool, and the remaining \$2.5 million covers salary increases and new investments directly target to help students grow and learn. Also discussed an upcoming ballot measure requesting a 10-year maintenance bod of \$19 million.

(4) City Council Update: South District Councilor Joan Shannon and Ward 5 Councilor Chip Mason

Provided information about upcoming City Council meetings and public hearings, including an executive sessions re the development agreement on the Burlington Town Center redevelopment, a presentation for the New Moran project, and Charter changes including eliminating tax appeals to the Board of Civil Authority and increasing the Council’s salaries from \$3,000 to \$5,000 to catch up with inflation since the last raise years ago.

(5) NPA Related Open Forum and Closing

- Charles Simpson announced that he will be running for the South District City Council seat.
- Joan Shannon announced that she will be running for re-election for the South District City Council seat.
- Elisa Nelson announced that she will be running for re-election for Ward Clerk.

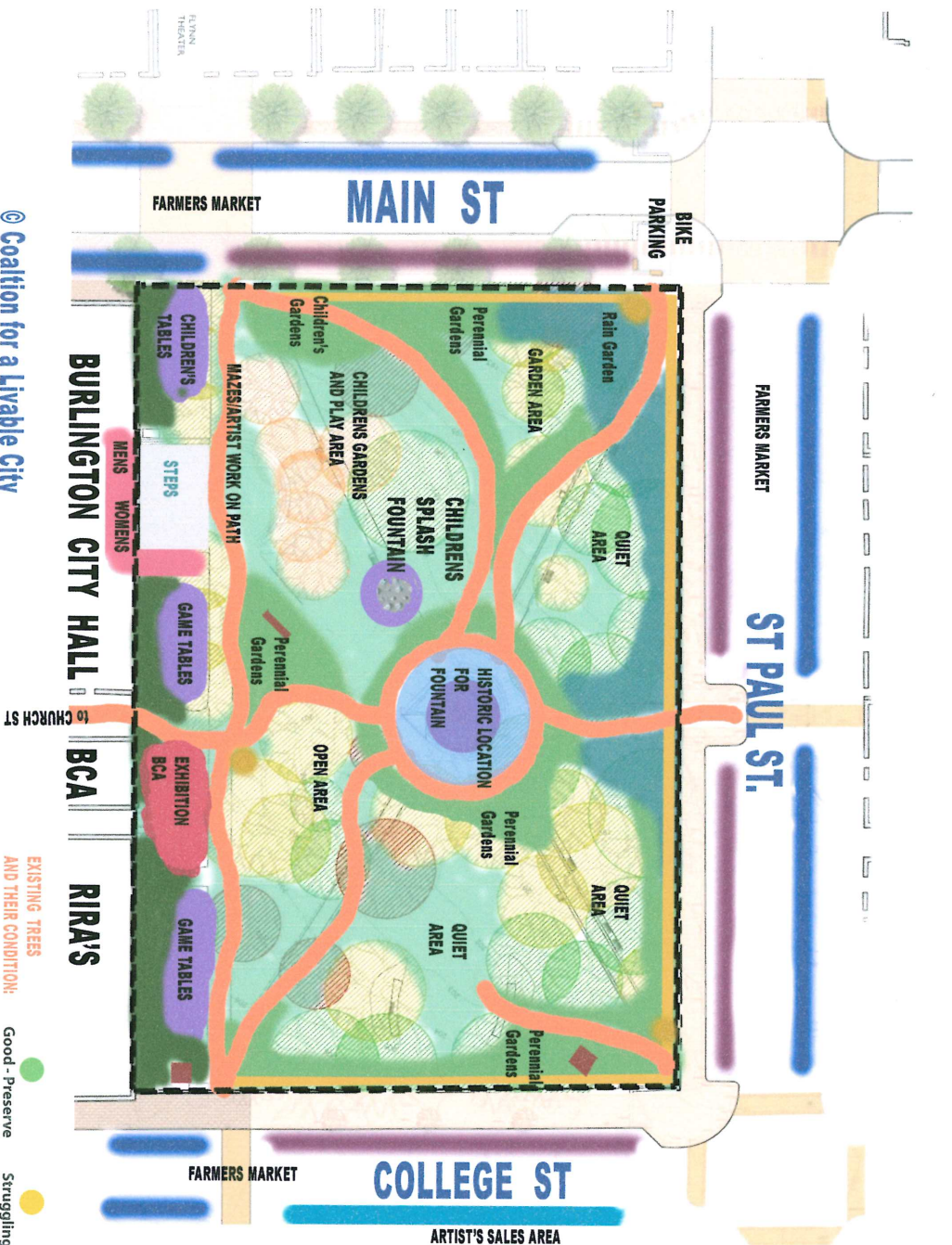

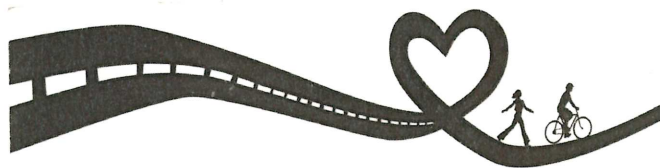
