Jackie Corbally-Opioid Policy Coordinator

Jackie is the City's new hire to be the Opioid Policy Coordinator between the City and Police Department. Currently we they are exploring the Comstat model – a model that is based on data collection Comstat brings stakeholders to hear what's going and what needs to be put in place for people to get treatment. Addiction carries a lot of shame and stigma which stops people from getting help. This is a chronic health disease that have complexity involving loss of housing, employment, safety. Heroin is ripping across our county. Current Department of Children and Families reports show more kids are coming into custody. VT is doing much better than partners in other New England states. Jackie has 30 years of social services experience. Cracking down on dealers coming into VT and increasing treatment and increasing prevention message. Also looking at affordable housing and workforce data. Comstat is part of Chittenden County Opiates Alliance (CCOA). Jackie's office is at BPD to be closer addicts and victims and hook them up with treatment and resources. The number of sex trafficking has increase. In Comstat looking at data on property crime, heroine violation, where are officers responding to calls. Mayor wants all this information to go into a portal. Having conversation in criminal justice to not penalize people if they are willing get help. Looking to drop from felony to misdemeanor. * See attachment of addiction resources.

Eagles Landing-Sandy and John Caulo, Assoc VT of Planning

Campus is Ward 6 but have facilities in Ward 5. Champlain's mission is to be the finest, small, professionally and globally focused school. Full time undergrad is 2200 students. Students that live on campus and Montreal and Dublin Ireland and scholarship in Shanghai. Have online program. 1600 students on continuing and graduate programs. Undergrad numbers are consistent but online have doubled. Great partners with local companies to provide ongoing professional dev. Also partners with feds on cyber skill and development. Graduating students ready and with the skill for employment. 96% that graduate have career success Cyber, gaming, security and divisions in criminal justice and humanities. More than 80% come out of VT but more than 50% stay in VT. This is a benefit to bring young people into VT to stay and live. Emergent Media Center (EMC) is celebrating 10anniversary which has maker's space and working with Generator. Eagles Landing is located on corner of St Paul and King St. Trying to relieve pressures of housing by creating student housing which is corner of Ward 3. With the City, have agreement of 600 beds on campus and 600 in community. Entered permit process in 2013 and came out middle of 2016. Now project is currently under construction. 105 apts. 1, 2, and 3 beds. Will have 4200 sq. space retail space and outdoor seating. Two separate parking totaling 66 spaces which public can access. Have internal and external bike spaces. Will also include shuttle route from this student housing to campus. Looking at late July 2018 to get students moved in.

City Council Updates

Sara Giannoni-Working on changing role of Police Commission. Sara, chairs the Public Safety Committee. Looking at evictions and how they can happen differently. Creating taskforce of police, housing, mental health.

Jane Knodell-CCTV is doing some strategic planning, looking at the decline of cable.

Burlington Telecom Com. This year need to find a partner. There is 9members of advisory board that has been created. Jan. 31st 5:30 will roll out plan. Location will be announced later.

Moran Plant-RFP process in late Dec. The new Moran group will present proposal at Jan. 23rd meeting. also researching demolition too. Inclusionary Zoning report will be posted on City Council under CDNR on Jan. 31st. Council will look at final development agreement of BTC. Councilors will push workforce development and jobs in community development benefits. *See attachment of Jane's notes

Legislative Report

Curt McCormack 6-3. On new committee called Energy and Technology. Working on utility regulations Cell towers and other IT issues. Working on bill modeled from CA that takes 5 years to get minimum wage to be \$15 so people will get to a point where they make enough money. Commuter Rail of St. Albans, Burlington, Essex to Montpelier will be looking at car to self-repelled diesel.

Jill Krowinski 6-3. Assigned to Transportation. Elected House Majority Leader. Issues focused on is about policy that grows the economy. Looking at current issue with benefit's cliff. This is an issue because if get a raise, then people would lose critical subsidies such as childcare which will set them back. Expanding broad band. Cleaning lakes and water ways. Issues around affordability and housing.

Selene Colbune 6-4. Newly elected and assigned to judicial committee. This committee can do some work on opioid crisis and criminal just reform. Many of this is driven by opioid crisis. Seeing that different counties will have different outcomes in sentencing, resources and treatment due to access and services. Looking to strength Guardian Ad litem which are volunteers that follows and helps children through the legal system. Franklin and Chittenden most need. Looking to decriminalize heroin.

Brian Cina 6-4. Newly elected and on Healthcare Committee. If affordable act gets appealed will lose 60% and will need to scramble to cover holes.

Brian Cina-Burlington Schools. This Tues. 8 to 4 passed budget that has 5.4 tax increase. Lead comprehensive plan of needs and will take half of increase to meet the most vulnerable students to provide needs such as AP classes and transportation. Looking at 10 year Capital plan.
